Easy Peach Crisp



Making fruit crisp has just become the easiest!

With 3 ingredients and 10 minutes, you can have a cozy fruit crisp ready for the oven.

Prep Time: 10 min
 Total Time: 40 Min
 Makes: 6 servings

- 1 pouch (1 lb 1.5 oz) Betty Crocker oatmeal cookie mix
- ½ cup cold butter
- 5 cups frozen sliced peaches, thawed & drained, or 1 can (29 oz) sliced peaches, drained

1. Heat oven to 375°F. In large bowl, place cookie mix. Cut in butter, using pastry blender or fork, until mixture looks like coarse crumbs.

2. In ungreased 8-inch square baking dish or 2-quart round casserole, place peaches. Sprinkle cookie mixture over peaches.

3. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until topping is golden brown. Serve warm or cool.

Variation: Why just use peaches? Experiment with other fruits or top warm crisp with a scoop of vanilla ice cream for a Fruit Crisp Ala' mode.
